Transporting Dry Ice by Air

Purpose

If you send clinical specimens, blood samples, frozen foods or any item utilizing frozen carbon dioxide (dry ice) as a refrigerant, then this is the course for you. This course assists shippers to interpret and apply the IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations (IATA DGR) to shipments being sent by air domestically and internationally. Full compliance with the Regulations and an understanding of the concepts behind them, and the associated Australian legislation, will ensure the safety of all who travel and protect shippers from unknowingly committing unlawful acts.

What you get

This course will help you apply the classification, packaging, marking and labeling and documentation requirements of the IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations with regard to dry ice, and understand the requirements set down by the Regulatory authorities.

Access to a copy of the IATA DGR is not required.

Course Qualification and Recognition

This course is approved by:

- The Civil Aviation Safety Authority of Australia (CASA).

A certificate is issued on successful completion of an end-of-course questionnaire and the qualification is valid for **TWO YEARS**.

Who should complete this course?

This course is suitable for people involved with the packaging, documentation or control of cargo that is refrigerated by dry ice being transported by air. It is a CASA requirement that any persons involved with the shipment of dry ice by air be trained in these requirements.

This course does not certify you to prepare, pack or document for air transport any Category A Infectious Substance, Category B Diagnostic or Clinical Specimen, or any other class of dangerous good.

Level of Competency

No previous knowledge or experience with air transport is required to complete the course.
